Relief Launch Engineer – Prince Rupert

Pacific Pilotage Authority is seeking a **Relief On-Call Launch Engineer** for our **Prince Rupert** launch operations. This position is offered subject to the terms and conditions of the current Canadian Merchant Service Guild agreement.

Overview

- Starting wage is \$54.52/hour (wage during training period, paid at 75%)
- Relief employees receive 16% of gross salary, exclusive of holiday pay and overtime, in lieu of benefits and an additional 6% in lieu of vacation time
- Successful candidates will be required to work shifts; a full shift is 12 hours.
- A list of the duties and qualifications are available on request.
- The successful individual must be available on short notice for relief opportunities.
- Due to the on-call nature of the work, successful candidates must be within commuting distance of Prince Rupert to cover shifts as needed.
- Responsible to the Chief Technical Officer for pilot boat maintenance and performance of seamanship duties.

Duties

- Performance of boat maintenance, including checking fluid/oil levels, routine and comprehensive checks of engine and deck equipment and record keeping of the above maintenance.
- Troubleshooting of systems. Training of crew in inspection procedures and operation of various systems. Planning and co-ordination of repairs as required. Assist with development of formal procedures for operation, checks and maintenance procedures.
- As required, performance of seamanship duties; including operation of deck machinery/appliances, look-out and watch keeping duties and basic boat husbandry.
- Assist, as required, in the performance of pilot-transfer duties during the pilot boarding or boarding-off of a vessel.
- Performance of marine emergency duties, including recovery of a person in the water, first-aid and the operation and maintenance of life-saving equipment.
- Other duties related to the operations of pilot transfers and the maintenance of property and equipment belonging to the Pacific Pilotage Authority.

Requirements

- Valid certificates for Class Four Marine Engineer, Marine First Aid and Transport Canada Medical are a prerequisite. *Experienced SVMOs or experienced candidates with lesser marine engineer qualifications may also be considered.
- As a federal crown corporation, it is a requirement that any employees are fully vaccinated
- Candidates must pass a medical screening, including drug and alcohol screening in line with a recruitment process for a safety sensitive position.
- It is essential that the successful candidate is a reliable self-starter and team player who is able to assume responsibility for maintenance duties, work collaboratively, and maintain calm in stressful situations.
